# Science - Light

- To recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines.
- To use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.
- To explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes.
- To use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.


#### **Maths**

Following the SAT Tests in May, the children will now explore the following curriculum areas in more detail:

**Investigating Statistics** - Charts, tables, line graphs, pie charts and averages (mean).

Area, Perimeter, Position & Direction - Finding the areas of trapeziums and parallelograms, exploring shapes with the same area but different perimeters, understanding scale factor with area and perimeter and reading position in all four quadrants including translations.

**Calculations** – Balancing equations, solving problems with one or two unknowns and using the order of operations to solve problems.

# RE – Buddhism – What do we mean by a good life?
